

to and from doctor, dentist, or other health professional's offices.

**Dispensing Regular Daily Medication** — \$30.00 per month. Cadets placed on medication for short periods of time, for treatment of a temporary illness, are not required to pay this monthly fee. Medicines, vitamins and other-than-normal medical attention received in or through the Fishburne infirmary will appear on the monthly account. The fees for professional services by a school doctor are billed to the account. Other medical charges will be billed to you by the provider of the service, and your payment should be made directly to the provider. The school nurse will assist when insurance claims are requested.

**Uniform Items**— Charges for lost uniform items, or repairs to uniform items, are billed to this account.

**Damage to Property** – Cadets who cause damage to equipment, furniture, barracks, or other property are held accountable for repairs or replacements. These fees will be charged to this account.

**Other Charges** — Charges for lost books, books damaged beyond normal wear and tear, and books or workbooks for selected classes are also billed to this account, as are fees for SAT, PSAT, and ACT tests, damage to school property, activities, trips, conferences, and other miscellaneous items, or items authorized by a parent. Cadets are not permitted to open charge accounts in the City of Waynesboro.

**GRADUATION FEE**

Graduating seniors are charged an additional fee of \$170.00, which covers the cost of their diploma and its frame.

**BADGES OF RANK**

As a student distinguishes himself in service to the FMS Corps of Cadets, he is promoted in rank. Such leadership positions generally require insignia and ribbons. The costs of these items will be debited against the Student Services Account, since they are required as a function of position.

**TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS**

**Responsibility for transportation to or from the school for any leave or furlough rests solely with the parent or guardian. Fishburne takes no responsibility for students during leave or furlough periods.**

**MULTIPLE MAILINGS OF CADET RECORDS**

In cases where, for the convenience of its patrons, the school

is asked to mail duplicate copies of all school communications to more than one address, a one-time, nonrefundable charge of \$100.00 per additional address will be billed to the patron who is responsible for a Cadet's financial obligations with the school. Financial statements will be supplied only to the individual responsible for payment of the Cadet's charges.

**GENERAL**

Cadets are accepted by Fishburne Military School upon the condition that they remain for the entire school year. If, however, a student is dismissed for a breach of school discipline, suspended, or withdraws before the close of the school year, the full charge for the entire school year becomes due and payable immediately.

Once a student has matriculated at the school, no tuition refund is made for any reason. The spending of one night at the school and/or completing the processing necessary to attend school, including classes and pre-class activities (as well as early arrival for Training Details or sports camps), constitutes matriculation.

**MEDICAL**

**Parents are required to provide adequate proof of health/hospitalization insurance or purchase insurance from the school.**

All students must have a current completed medical examination report and certificate of immunizations on file with the school prior to matriculation. Fishburne adheres to regulations established by the Commonwealth of Virginia. Prescription medication must be dispensed by authorized Fishburne personnel.

**ACADEMIC**

Graduation requirements are dictated by university and college entrance requisites as well as by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Virginia Association of Independent Schools.

**FISHBURNE MILITARY SCHOOL**

*FINANCIAL DATA 2017-2018*

The cost of a Fishburne education is, in reality, an investment in a young Cadet's future. It is not entirely an additional expense because parents with students at home must still feed and clothe them, provide for their educational and recreational expenses, pay for their personal needs and, in many cases, provide them with the use of a car. Most of these expenses are either absorbed or greatly reduced by an education at Fishburne Military School.

The reasonable expenses of a Fishburne education do not completely cover what the school pays out to give each student a top quality education. Fortunately, the school's income is supplemented by generous gifts from alumni, patrons and friends who give to our endowment fund.

The tuition that Fishburne charges is impacted by the fact that the school is a tax-exempt corporation, which means that donations to its annual giving campaign may be deductible from United States taxes.

**THE ANNUAL FEE**

The 2017-2018 annual fee is \$32,900 before any applicable discounts. This fee does not include uniforms; new students pay an additional \$2000 for uniforms. Returning students will pay only for replacement items.

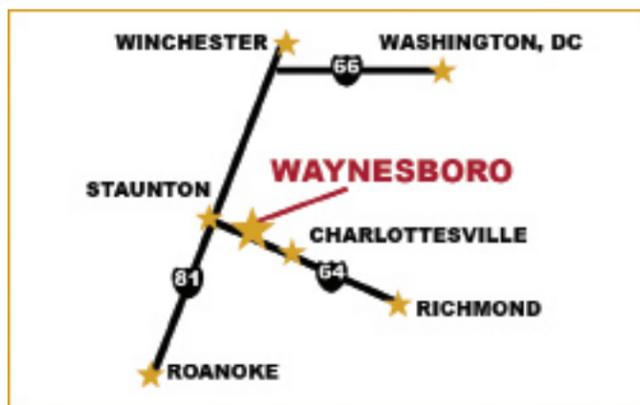

**The above list of required uniform items must be maintained throughout the school year. Any lost or damaged uniform items must be replaced at the parent's expense. Any rented item which is lost or damaged so that it can no longer be used must be replaced at the parent's expense. JROTC items must also be returned or replaced at the parent's expense.**

The annual fee includes the following items and services:

- Academic instruction
- Adult supervision
- Living quarters and utilities for boarding students
- Career guidance and counseling
- A personal advisor for each Cadet
- Three well-balanced meals each day (Brunch and Dinner on Sunday, Lunch only for day students Monday through Friday)
- Military training and discipline
- Athletic guidance and instruction
- Use of the school's library
- Applicable audiovisual instruction
- Training available for rifle marksmanship
- Normal day care in the school's infirmary
- Entertainment for which the school is host
- Transportation in connection with school trips for academic purposes and athletic competition
- A copy of the school's yearbook
- Access to the computerized SAT tutorial programs
- Use of the school's computer center
- Admission to home athletic contests
- All school facilities available for recreation
- Recreational planning
- School supplies associated with instructional activities (Basic lab supplies, for example)
- Six copies of a senior's transcript
- Social amenities training
- Rental of Textbooks
- Haircuts (boarding students only)
- Laundry and dry cleaning for boarding students
- Grades and other school communications sent to one address only

The annual fee does not cover all costs. Examples of the costs that are not covered include the cost of overnight care in the school infirmary; prescription drugs; dispensing of regular daily medication; professional services of a doctor, dentist, etc.; personal items; paper, pencils, pens, notebooks; graduation fee for seniors; replacement of uniform articles; specified books; e-books; computer and/or workbooks; laptop or computer; misplaced or damaged books; SAT, PSAT, ACT tests; damage to school property; activities, trips, or conferences; other miscellaneous items, or items authorized by patron, other than specified above.



Fishburne Military School is fully accredited by the Virginia Association of Independent Schools (VAIS) and by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).

**Students whose parents reside outside the United States or its territories must use the Single Payment Plan. International Students must pay a \$2,000.00 I-20 deposit. There is no single payment discount for international cadets. Deposit is due prior to school issuing I-20.**

## DEPOSIT

After an applicant is accepted, a **nonrefundable** deposit is required to guarantee a position in the Fishburne Corps of Cadets. This deposit is a portion of the annual fee. For the convenience of its patrons, Fishburne offers three methods by which the annual fee may be paid.

## PAYMENT PLANS

**\*New students pay an additional \$2,000.00 for uniforms. The uniform fee is due prior to matriculation and is included in the dollar amounts listed below. Returning students will pay only for replacement items.**

**\*Some advanced academic courses will require additional tools and texts. Parents will be notified in advance if their son is enrolled in such a class.**

## METHODS OF PAYMENT

Fishburne Military School accepts multiple forms of cash payments for tuition and associated fees. This includes personal checks, cashier's checks, money order or wire transfer. For the convenience of our parents, Fishburne also accepts most major credit cards. A 2% convenience fee will be added to all tuition payments made by credit card. ## SINGLE-PAYMENT PLAN

Under this plan, the patron pays the entire annual fee prior to matriculation, in return for which a discount of \$1,000.00 is received (\$500.00 for day students). These discounts may be prorated based upon other scholarships or discounts.

## MONTHLY PLAN

Under the monthly payment plan, the annual fee is paid with an initial payment and nine monthly installments. There is no finance charge for this payment plan; however, a \$600.00 annual fee, which is due in advance, is added to offset administrative costs. In the event that the account becomes 30 days past due, the student will be subject to suspension from the school until such time as the account is current

## REDUCTIONS ON TUITION

Eligible cadets can receive one of the following tuition reductions:

- \$5000 for sons, brothers, or grandsons of a confirmed Fishburne Military School alumnus or other military school that is or has been a member of the Association of Military Colleges and Schools of the United States (AMCSUS)
- \$2500 per year for sons of active duty military service personnel, including all of the armed services, the National Guard, and all Armed Forces Reserve Units; sons of veterans who have retired from any of the Armed Forces, National Guard, or Armed Forces Reserve Units after twenty years (or more) of active military service
- \$2500 per year per son enrolled for families with two or more

sons in attendance during the same year

- \$1000 for the first year of attendance for students with a minimum of one year participation in a JROTC program, prior to enrollment at Fishburne

These discounts are/may be prorated based upon other discounts or scholarships and the period of enrollment.

## VETERANS BENEFITS

Fishburne Military School has been approved by the Virginia Department of Veterans Services, State Approving Agency to provide education and training to eligible students under Chapter 35 of Title 38, U.S. Code (Survivors and Dependents Educational Assistance Program). ## BAND SCHOLARSHIPS

Several scholarships of amounts up to \$2,000.00 (based upon level of talent) are offered to students who are able to contribute musically to the Fishburne Military School marching band. For new students, an interview on the FMS campus is required. **The student should bring his instrument and be prepared to play for the FMS Bandmaster or his designated agent.** The decision of the Bandmaster will be final. The recipient of a Band Scholarship **must** participate in band for the entire year. The scholarship is applied to the last payment due the school, based on the payment plan selected.

## CADET ALLOWANCE

Fishburne Military School enforces a cash-free campus policy. Cadets are not permitted to carry or be in possession of any cash at any time while in attendance.

Fishburne Military School does not administer funds for cadets to draw cash allowances. In order for cadets to have spending money, they will need to have a pre-paid debit or credit card that is administered by the parents or guardians.

## STUDENT SERVICES FUND

All cadets are required to place funds into the Student Services Fund at Fishburne Military School prior to enrollment. Boarding Students must place \$1,500.00 (\$2,000.00 for foreign students) and Day Students must place \$500.00 into the Fund. From this Fund, the fees listed below will be deducted on a monthly basis. (The Bed Deposit, and Foreign Student Fee will not be deducted from this Fund.) If the balance in the account for boarding students falls below \$250.00 (\$750.00 for foreign students), the parent will be required to add to the account until the balance reaches \$500.00 (\$1,500.00 for foreign students). Day students must have a balance above \$100.00. Any funds remaining at the end of the school year, after all outstanding charges and tuition payments have been satisfied, will be returned to the parent, or if the parent desires, rolled over into the student's account for the next year.

**Monthly Charge Account** — for Cadet Store and Infirmary charges. Parents direct monthly Cadet Store charge limits. This account can only be used for essential school supplies and/or discretionary purchases. Items necessary for a cadet to function properly at the school may also be issued at the school's discretion. Parents will be charged \$25.00 for transportation of their son
